Terms and Conditions Honi Soit Writing Competition 2020

- 1. The Annual Honi Soit Writing Competition is organised by Honi Soit Publication in conjunction with the Students' Representative Council Sydney University and Prize money is donated by the donor, an alumnus of the University of Sydney.
- 2. The competition is open to all currently enrolled Sydney University students. This includes students who have taken a leave of absence from their studies.
- 3. There is no entry fee to enter this competition.
- 4. Entry submission is to be by online application form available here: (http://honisoit.com/2020/03/writingcompetition2020/)
- 5. Students can submit one entry per category, a total of two pieces maximum.
- 6. Only one submission will be accepted per person per category. Multiple articles from the same person will not be included.
- 7. Entries open on 11th May 2020, and close on 6th July 2020 at 11.59pm. After this date and time, no further entries to the competition will be permitted.
- 8. No responsibility can be accepted for submissions not received for whatever reason.
- 9. The Organiser of the competition reserves the right to cancel or amend the competition and these terms and conditions without notice for any event outside of the organiser's control. Any changes to the competition will be notified to entrants as soon as possible by the organiser.
- 10. 2020 competition has two categories NON- FICTION, which can be up to 1200 words, and FICTION, which can be up to 2000 words.
- 11. 2020 Judges are Tilly Lawless (Fiction) and Rick Morton (Non-Fiction).
- 12. A shortlist of ten entries per category will be chosen anonymously by the current Honi Soit editorial team before submitting the anonymous shortlist to the judges for final selection for FIRST, SECOND and THIRD prizes. The judges' decision is final.
- 13. Winners will be contacted on Monday 3rd August and publicly announced at the Award Presentation Event (Date TBC due to COVID-19 University wide event cancellations).
- 14. Winners will also be published in an edition of Honi Soit in Semester 2 and online.

- 15. Prize amounts are determined each year at the discretion of the donor.
- 16. The competition in 2020 offers 3 Prizes. First place winner is offered \$1000. Second and Third place are offered \$500 and \$250 respectively.
- 17. Prize money is donated by the donor, an alumnus of the University of Sydney and is distributed by the university.
